





STATUS UPDATE – MARCH 5, 2024 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION

This report is to inform your Board of our operations to complete the March 5, 2024 Presidential Primary Election. The election status update supports the Department's ongoing commitment to fair, accessible, and transparent election services.

Vote by Mail

The Department issued just over 5.7 million Vote by Mail (VBM) ballots, and 1,313,240 have been tallied as of March 13th. Voters returned their ballots through our Ballot Drop Boxes, the United States Postal Service, and our Vote Centers. Vote by Mail continues to be our most heavily utilized method of voting thanks to the safety and convenience it offers. Currently, VBM accounts for 80.5% of the turnout in this election.

The outstanding VBM ballots left to be processed are pending signature cures from voters whose signatures on the Return Envelope were missing or did not match their registration records. These voters have been notified with instructions on how to cure their ballots to be counted. The RR/CC will accept cure notices through March 27, 2024.

Vote Centers

In-person voting was completed on Election Day, March 5th at 8:00 PM. There were 644 Vote Centers and RR/CC headquarters for the March Presidential Primary Election. There have been 318,499 Vote Center ballots tallied as of March 12th. Election Day continues to be the highest turnout day with 239,164 check-ins on Election Day. Currently, Vote Centers account for 19.5% of the turnout in this election.

Voter Turnout

We have noted a slower rate of VBM return and fewer check-ins at Vote Centers for this election compared to similar elections. There was a noted increase in Vote Center activity as we approached Election Day, with 299,055 check-ins over the last four days, including Election Day. Like other critical services that the County provides, equity, availability, and accessibility remain paramount in our voting model. While we would like to see a higher turnout, we understand that there are a variety of factors that influence the participation levels. The tables below include the overall turnout and by Supervisorial District as of March 13th.

Election Results Reporting

The election tally began on March 5th at 8:00 PM at the Ballot Processing Center in the City of Industry. As of March 13th, 1,631,739 ballots have been processed. We have observed the continued trend of a large volume of VBM ballots returned on Election Day and in the mail on the days after. These VBM ballots come through Election Day via our Ballot Drop Boxes and Vote Centers. We receive additional ballots via the USPS on Election Day and over the days after. These VBM ballots must go through signature verification, ballot extraction, and tally.

Election results updates may take place over the weekend if required. The election is expected to be certified on March 29th.

Election Observer Program

The Department conducts an extensive *Election Observer Program* as part of our commitment to open and transparent elections. The Election Observer Program provides an opportunity for public observation of election processes to maintain integrity, encourage participation, and build voter confidence. Election Observers are provided access to Vote Centers, Check-in Centers, and the Ballot Processing Center to observe voting and election procedures. Some observable activities occurring at the Ballot Processing Center are:

- Logic and accuracy testing of the vote tabulation system used to conduct a central count of Vote by Mail (VBM) and in-person ballots (completed)
- Ballot transportation and delivery at a Check-in Center (completed)
- Election Night reporting (completed)
- Ballot intake, preparation, and storage (completed)
- VBM operations such as automated signature verification, data processing, ballot extraction, remakes, and ballot preparation for tally (ongoing)
- Processing provisional and conditional voter registration ballots received at Vote Centers (ongoing)
- Post-election canvassing and retention of election materials (ongoing)

The Election Observer Program at the Ballot Processing Center began on February 11th and runs through March 29th. Election observers are encouraged to check the public schedule of events on LAVOTE.GOV and must comply with all *Election Observer Panel Plan Rules and Guidelines*.

Executive Dashboard

The attached Executive Dashboard (Attachment I) contains critical updates on election preparation activities. This dashboard will be included with all future status updates and will evolve over time to reflect operational priorities.
