First Post-Election Night Ballot Count Update for the 2025 Statewide Special Election

LOS ANGELES – Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean C. Logan announced the first post-Election Night ballot count update for the November 4, 2025 Statewide Special Election.

The update includes **91,286** ballots processed since Election Night. This update includes ballots returned to the United States Postal Service (USPS) and Ballot Drop Boxes on Election Day.

The total election results count is now **2,064,857**, which is **35.33**% of registered voters. Election results can be viewed on LAVOTE.GOV.

The next ballot count update will be on Thursday, November 6. The full schedule of ballot counting updates is available on the <u>Canvass Update Schedule</u>.

Many Vote by Mail ballots were returned on Election Day. The RR/CC continues to prioritize the timely processing of these ballots to establish a clear number of outstanding ballots in this election.

The preliminary estimate of outstanding ballots to be processed is 584,812. See the categories below:

- Vote by Mail ballots: 560,000
- Conditional Voter Registration ballots: 22,951
- Provisional ballots: 1,861

The estimate includes Vote by Mail ballots returned to the USPS and ballots returned in a Ballot Drop Box or Vote Center on Election Day.

The number of outstanding Vote by Mail ballots will increase as the RR/CC continues to accept ballots postmarked by Election Day and received through Tuesday, November 11 (E+7). These ballots are not included in the estimate.

Outstanding estimates are Countywide and are not currently available by jurisdiction as ballots are received and processed in batches throughout the county. The RR/CC will continue to process, verify, and count all outstanding ballots in the Official Election Canvass.

The Official Election Canvass is a 30-day period in which the RR/CC processes and verifies all outstanding ballots to ensure that every eligible ballot cast by Election Day is counted.
