



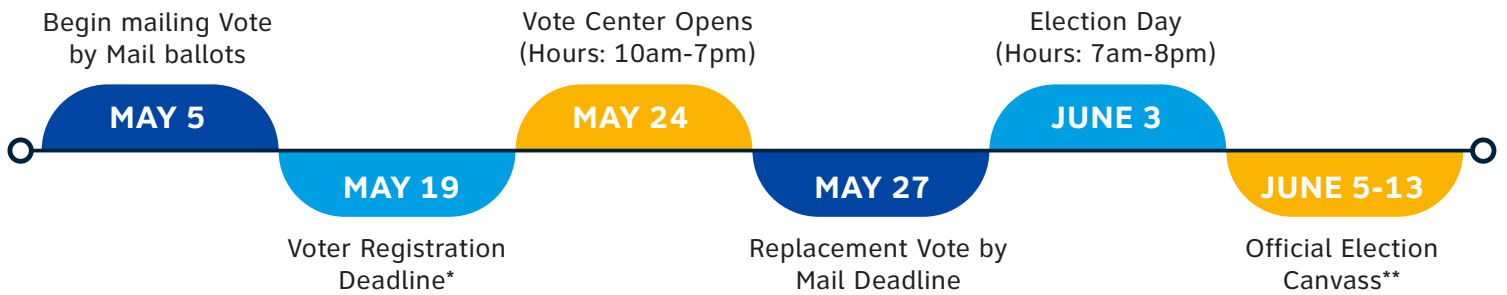

SAN MARINO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT SPECIAL PARCEL TAX ELECTION

PURPOSE OF THIS ELECTION

The June 3rd election in the San Marino Unified School District will decide whether to extend the expiring school parcel tax for an additional six years to maintain school programs. The measure requires approval from at least two-thirds of voters to pass.

ELECTION TIMELINE



*The last day a voter can register and be mailed a ballot.

**Vote by Mail, Conditional, and Provisional ballots returned/cast by Election Day will be processed, verified, and tallied.

VOTING OPTIONS

1 VOTE CENTER

The Vote Center opens on May 24th.

Voters can return their mail-in ballot at the Vote Center.

Newly eligible voters can register and vote at the Vote Center.

2 VOTE BY MAIL

Ballots begin mailing on May 5th.

Sign and date the Return Envelope.

Mark and return your ballot early.

3 BALLOT DROP BOX

All participating drop boxes open on May 5th.

Mark and return your ballot at any drop box.

Ballot Drop Boxes will close at 8 PM on Election Day.

All ballots must be returned or postmarked by Election Day

FAQS

Q: What do I do if I need a replacement ballot?

A: Voters can request a replacement Vote by Mail ballot to their current residence or temporary address. The last day to request a replacement ballot is Tuesday, May 27. Voters can request a replacement ballot by visiting [LAVOTE.GOV/ReplaceBallot](https://www.lavote.gov/ReplaceBallot) or calling **(800) 815-2666, option 2**.

Q: How do I register to vote after the close of registration?

A: Any eligible voter who misses the registration deadline can still register and vote by visiting a Vote Center.
