### MEASURES APPEARING ON THE BALLOT

#### COUNTY MEASURES- (1)

##### LOS ANGELES COUNTY VOTE PASSAGE - Majority Vote 50%+1

- **Essential Services Restoration Act for Los Angeles County General Sales Tax Measure**

Shall the measure to help our community address severe federal cuts enacted by the President and Congress; reduce the loss of essential services, including healthcare for County residents; reduce the risk of closing the County's four public hospitals and numerous clinics, and significant healthcare provider layoffs and other service cuts by enacting a 1/2 percent (0.5%) general sales tax for 5 years, generating approximately \$1 billion annually, with independent audits, be adopted?

#### LOCAL JURISDICTION MEASURES – (7)

##### CITY OF BELL GARDENS VOTE PASSAGE - Majority Vote 50%+1

- **Keep Bell Gardens Sales Tax Revenues Local Measure**

To protect and stabilize funding for Bell Gardens services like police/emergency response; maintenance/repair of streets, sidewalks and City facilities; park maintenance and enhancements; youth/senior programs; Community Family Service Center; and for any other general governmental purpose, shall the City's current 3/4% transactions (sales) and use tax rate be increased by a quarter percent to 1 % to raise an additional \$1.2 million annually?

##### COMPTON UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT VOTE PASSAGE - 55% of the Votes Cast

- To fix deteriorating roofs, plumbing, heating, electrical and other systems, enhance school safety, and construct, renovate, rehabilitate and modernize classrooms, sites and facilities, including media and performing arts centers, technology centers and athletic complexes, shall Compton Unified School District's measure authorizing \$360,000,000 in bonds at legal rates be adopted, with average levies of \$60 per \$100,000 assessed value (approximately \$22,000,000 annually) while bonds are outstanding, with citizen oversight, no money for administrative salaries, and all money locally controlled?

## LOCAL JURISDICTION MEASURES – (7) Continued

### CITY OF GARDENA – (1)

#### VOTE PASSAGE - Majority Vote 50%+1

- City of Gardena Services Measure. Shall the measure providing long-term funding for City of Gardena's general services, such as maintaining fire, paramedic, police, 911 response; hiring and retaining well-trained police helping prevent property crimes; keeping public areas/parks safe/clean; addressing homelessness; repairing streets and potholes; maintaining afterschool programs and senior services; by establishing a ¼¢ sales tax, providing approximately \$3,900,000 annually until ended by voters, requiring audits, public spending disclosure, all funds controlled locally, be adopted?

### CITY OF INGLEWOOD – (1)

#### VOTE PASSAGE - Majority Vote 50%+1

- Ordinance to Amend the Inglewood Fire Code to Permit the Sale and Use of Certain Fireworks Within the City of Inglewood. Shall an ordinance be adopted that repeals the City's existing ban on the public's use of Safe and Sane Fireworks, permits their sale within Inglewood under a regulated framework, and establishes rules and penalties for violations?

### LAWNDALE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT- (1)

#### VOTE PASSAGE -55% of the Votes Cast

- With no projected increase to current tax rates, shall Lawndale Elementary School District's measure to continue modernization of outdated classrooms and school facilities; enhance school security and student safety; and replace aging plumbing and electrical systems; issuing \$42,000,000 of bonds at legal rates be adopted, generating on average \$2.8 million annually while bonds are outstanding at rates of approximately \$30 per \$100,000 assessed value, with citizens' oversight, annual independent audits, and all money staying local?

### CITY OF POMONA- (1)

#### VOTE PASSAGE - Majority Vote 50%+1

- Shall a measure repealing the City's 9% Utility Users Tax on water service be adopted?"

### CITY OF SAN MARINO- (1)

#### VOTE PASSAGE - Majority Vote 50%+1

- To maintain funding (that The State of California and Los Angeles County cannot take) exclusively for City of San Marino services including: repairing streets/sidewalks/alleyways/potholes and other City infrastructure, improving public safety, providing youth and senior programs, library and park maintenance and enhancements, and general government use; shall the City of San Marino measure be adopted levying a 1 percent transaction and use tax, raising \$1,651,000 annually, until ended by voters?
